Heather transformed an old pig house next to her family home into a fully equipped studio and display gallery. In this relaxed, intimate setting she brings 30 years' experience in teaching and goldsmithing to share the skills of jewellery making.

During each beginner session, under Heather's personal tuition, participants will be shown the basics of jewellery making and will go on to produce their own piece of sterling silver jewellery, a tangible and unique memory to take home. Heather offers bespoke classes for intermediate and

&4 AN ANCIENT CRAFT IN THE PRESENT DAY

The origins of goldsmithing in Ireland date to the early bronze age with many examples being found throughout the country. Medieval goldsmiths were highly esteemed for their technical knowledge and skill working with precious metals and rare stones. New technologies, such as computer aided design and 3D printing have revolutionised the jewellery industry allowing production of a finished model to occur within hours.

DOCUMENTATION

Heather's jewellery is fabricated by hand in the workshop using age old techniques, tools, and equipment. During your visit you will have the opportunity to discover Heather's inspiration behind her work, make your own piece of jewellery using these techniques and learn about the history of jewellery making from the storyboards dotted around the workshop.
